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
To our entire Storm family,

Coaches feedback...

Thunder

A solid but difficult start for the team this season with lots of injury and illness that have hampered the teams chances of getting a full Thunder squad out each week. Both Mondays and Saturdays are proving very difficult for consistency of players, which in turn disrupts the progression we would hope for at this point. However, the core players that are attending training and matches cannot be faulted on their efforts to improve and their determination to give the opposition a good run for their money! The team are playing in the HINL division 1 indoors at Stevenage Leisure centre and in the Welwyn and Hatfield Saturday league division 1. Shout out to Mollie and Macy who are leading the team so well despite the difficulties they are experiencing in getting a regular team of 7 and we feel that both deserve recognition for their efforts. Onwards and upwards for the ladies as they have so much to give.

Blizzard have gelled as a squad which was apparent right from the start of the season. They have a really good unspoken understanding of each other on court and each combination of players subbed on and off is equally as strong and effective as another. The younger players are starting to show their confidence in the squad and will develop even more alongside the more experienced squad members. The ladies all listen and absorb at training and this shows in their game play where we see the skills being put into practice. They are not afraid to ask questions which is helping them to think for themselves. They also play in division 2 at Welwyn on Saturdays and are doing really well with some fabulous wins and buzzing match reports. A really great start to the season for this squad who are going from strength to strength and it's so hard to pick only one player to specifically mention. However, we would like to give a big shout out to Hannah and Laura this term for their partnership in the attacking D which is fabulous to watch. They have both come up against some tough defensive opposition and have kept their heads whilst still playing to a high level. Well done Blizzard. Keep working hard.

The Lightning ladies are steadily beginning to gel as a squad and have a good record of attendance at training. They are offering really good feedback on what they feel needs to be worked on, along with coaches input and observations and are working hard to improve both individually and as a team. The ladies play well when they remember to slow the game down and not to rush or force the overhead passes. There is great versatility amongst the squad with several of them stepping into the shooting D with some great results. Defensively the whole squad work hard and need to be congratulated for their tenacity on court. They play on a Thursday in the HINL indoor league division 3 which is a challenge but improvement is starting to show and they also play division 3 at Welwyn on Saturdays. The player we would like to give a shout out to is Paige. She is the Captain for Lightning and always attends training, organises the team fairly and has really improved in her own game play. She is positively vocal on court and her confidence has grown both in her game and in her organisational skills. A great start to the season for the ladies.

A small group of the ladies play in the I Netball League at Stanborough on Tuesdays, joined by a regular few from the Seniors who have helped make up the team. Always attends training, took on the Captaincy half way through, has played in all but one match (due to a burst tyre) and has worked so hard in her personal development.
